





- ~ What is a relic? A relic is a piece of the body of a saint, an item owned or used by the saint, or an object which has been touched to the tomb of a saint.
- ~ How do we treat relics? The remains of saints are surrounded with special care and veneration because the mortal remains of the deceased are associated in some manner with the holiness of their souls which await reunion with their bodies in the resurrection.

#### ~ Three classes of relics?


- ◆ 1st Class Relics consists of a part of the Saint themselves, such as a bone, hair, or blood; all instruments of Christ's Passion (cross, thorns, nails).
- ◆ 2nd Class Relics consists of a piece of the saints clothing, something that was owned or used by the saint (chalice, rosary etc).
- ♦ 3rd Class Relics consists of something that has been touched to a 1st Class Relic.
- ~ What should I do? You are welcome to say a prayer. You are also welcome to touch a prayer card or a rosary to the relics.



# Why does Mass here possibly not look like it does at my parish?

What is ad orientem? Ad orientem is a Latin phrase that translates as toward the orient, or toward the East. Mass ad orientem, then, is when Mass is celebrated with ALL the people facing East (All means that everyone, priest and lay faithful, face the same direction). The priest does not have his back toward you, just as the man in front of you does not eitherwe are all facing the same direction.

Why East? East is the direction of the rising sun, which is a symbol of the resurrection of our Lord. East is also the direction according to scripture, from which the Lord will come from when He returns. Instead of being a circle, where people face each other, the Mass has a more upward and vertical focus where the priest stands in union with the people and as their mediator. By the way- this auditorium is facing the East - East Central!

Why so many servers? Our parish culture invites young men to serve Mass every weekend, there is no schedule. We have created a way for all of them to participate and be involved at the Mass every weekend. This conference is a parish event, so they are welcome as usual! The teens of our parish are our future!

Why so much chanting? It has been said Singing is Praying Twice. Mass is the highest and best form of prayer. Mass is the worship of God Himself. At every Mass Christ Jesus Himself offers His Body and Blood to the Eternal Father. This is different and

better than any other form of worship. It is not us worshiping God alone; but us participating in the worship of the Son to His Father in the power of the Holy Spirit. We actually enter into their worship. It is not so much about what we do, as it is what we partake in. Thus our every action and word spoken or sung is of vital importance, it is participation in something truly divine. Because this is the case, Holy Mass is the best place to pray and sing.

Musicam Sacram, the document on the sacred music from the Second Vatican Council states what should be sung at a "Sung Mass," "The following belong to the First Degree, to be sung: the greeting of the priest together with he reply of the people; the prayer, the acclamations at the Gospel, the prayer over the offerings, the preface with its dialogue and the Sanctus, the final doxology of the canon, the Lord's prayer with its introduction; the Pax Domini, the prayer after the communion, the formulas of dismissal." Notice how the First degree does not even include the hymns that we normally sing; those are actually found in the third degree. Singing these "new parts" is of great importance. It is singing and praying with the Church. Keep on singing!

Why Latin? For the last few decades, we have not used much Latin during the Mass. We do use some Latin, for example at just about every funeral and wedding we sing the Ave Maria (which is the Hail Mary in Latin). During Christmas we sing Adestes Fideles (O Come All Ye Faithful) and in the hymn Angels We Have Heard on High we sing, "Gloria, in excelsis Deo" (Glory to God in the Highest). When we

sing, Immaculate Mary, we sing "Ave Maria," multiple times in each refrain translated it means "Hail Mary."

The Second Vatican council, in its document on the Mass, while permitting translations of the Mass into the vernacular, i.e. in our everyday spoken language, said that "care must be taken to ensure that the faithful may also be able to say or sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them" (SC 36, 54). As a Church we have not done this well. Unfortunately, after 1965 there was a change that gave this impression: we went from using almost all Latin at Mass, to almost totally excluding it. We are part of a 2,000 year old Church; whose mother tongue is Latin. The Mass that was celebrated prior to Vatican II is the same Mass that is celebrated NOW. There should be a natural flow from one to another; what a gift!
